Part six of our local area history series

First United Methodist Church – part 2

In 1910 a new church site was purchased at Citrus and Hawley Streets. Two houses were located on the property, one a duplex. The decision was made to physically move the original church building to the new site and on October 10, 1910 the move was completed. During the transition, services were held in the Presbyterian Church. The cottage that stood on the site was moved to the rear of the church. Facing East on Hawley, it was remodeled and became the parsonage.

The original property at Citrus and Prescott was sold in March 1912 for \$2,600 and later became the location of the Eustis Elementary School. On May 21, 1927 the First Methodist Episcopal Church of Eustis was incorporated.


The year 1939 brought unification of Methodism as Methodist Episcopal Churches north and south joined the Protestant Methodist group to become the United Methodist Church.

In 1941 the Grand Island Methodist Church united with the church in Eustis. A new parsonage was built in 1947 at the corner of Center and Lemon Streets. In 1951 steps were taken to build a new church edifice. Property on South Grove Street, between Woodward and Badger Avenue, was purchased. It was the former location of the high school building, which had been condemned and razed. Ground-breaking for the new church was held on September 2, 1951. Following completion of the church and the first educational unit, the official consecration service was held on February 1, 1953.

Since that time, many things have changed with the United Methodist Church and their property. Such as: the original property lines were changed because of the "new four-lane highway", which cut back on the Grove Street frontage; an additional plot of land was purchased south of Badger Avenue causing it to be closed to traffic; a new structure on the corner of Woodward and Eustis Streets, providing new classrooms, library, kitchen, etc. With growth comes change.
